

HUDAK AFTER PUBLIC SECTOR WORKERS

New research shows that Hudak's proposed cuts of 100,000 public sector jobs would have devastating effects across the province and lead to skyrocketing unemployment rates for many communities.

"This research points to the danger of Hudak's brash schemes. Especially in smaller- and

medium-sized communities outside Toronto, economies and peoples' futures will be seriously threatened; it will take years to recover," warned OFL President Sid Ryan.

CLC CONVENTION

OSSTF/FEESO had a strong presence at the 2014 Canadian Labour Congress. We registered 53 delegates and had 7 OSSTF/FEESO members

representing Ontario Labour Councils. The delegation was committed to their responsibilities and attendance at convention was excellent. Volunteers for the OSSTF/FEESO table, speaker at the microphone and mike muffins were plentiful and keen. Jessica Burnie was elected as the Workers with Disabilities representative to the Canadian Council. The solidarity and unified actions of our delegation can be attributed, in large part, to the caucus meeting on April 24th at the Sheraton Downtown Toronto and it is recommended that this practice continue prior to CLC and OFL conventions. OSSTF/FEESO made a \$2000 donation to assist the family of a woman who had a stroke at convention.
